The School Board Appointment Commission of Anne Arundel County today reminded those interested in the District 32 seat on the Board of Education of Anne Arundel County that the deadline for applications is noon on Friday, November 3, 2017.

Applications can be submitted via email to sbac@aacps.org or mailed to the School Board Appointment Commission, c/o the Board of Education Office, 2644 Riva Road, Annapolis, MD 21401. Applications can also be hand-delivered to the Board of Education Office.

Applicants must be residents of Legislative District 32.

All applications, whether mailed, hand-delivered, or sent by email, must be received by the Board of Education Office by noon on Friday, November 3, 2017.

The 13-member commission is charged with appointing individuals to fill vacancies on the Board of Education as the Board transitions from an entirely appointed Board to one that is entirely elected.

Upcoming meetings

The Commission will meet at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 14, to interview candidates for the seat. If necessary, additional interviews will be conducted beginning at 7 p.m. on Thursday, November 16. All interviews will be held in the Board Room of Anne Arundel County Public Schools' Parham Building, located at 2644 Riva Road in Annapolis.

A meeting to vote on an appointment is scheduled for Monday, November 27, at the Parham Building.
