READING, LANGUAGE ARTS, AND ENGLISH INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM FOR GRADES PREKINDERGARTEN - 12

A. PURPOSE

- 1. Maryland State Board Bylaw (COMAR) specifies that the school system shall:
 - a. provide an instructional program in reading and English language arts each year for all students in grades Prekindergarten through 5;
 - b. provide an instructional program in English language arts for all students grades 6-8;
 - c. provide an instructional program in reading according to the identified needs of students in grades 6-8; and
 - d. offer an English program 9-12 which enables students to meet graduation requirements and to select English language arts electives.
- 2. Maryland State Board Bylaw (COMAR) also requires the following:
 - a. Reading and English Language Arts Programs in the state will provide for the diversity of student needs, abilities, and interests in the early, middle, and high school years; and
 - b. These programs shall include content standards and Core Learning Goals set forth by the State Department of Education.

B. ISSUE

Maryland State Board Bylaw (COMAR) requires that the reading and English language arts programs shall include the content standards set forth by the state and that each local school system shall provide reading and English language arts curriculum documents for the elementary and secondary schools under its jurisdiction that include the state's current content standards and are aligned with the Voluntary State Curriculum, as developed by the Maryland State Department of Education in collaboration with local school systems.

C. POSITION

Each student shall have the opportunity to participate in the comprehensive reading and English language arts program required by COMAR. The Superintendent will prepare programs in reading, language arts, and English that will meet or exceed the requirements of Maryland Education Law and Maryland State Board Bylaw.

D. IMPLEMENTATION

The Superintendent is authorized to develop regulations to implement this policy.
