STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

A. PURPOSE

To provide guidance regarding student organizations that desire to conduct meetings or activities in Anne Arundel County Public Schools (AACPS).

B. BACKGROUND

Student organizations can provide an enriching and beneficial experience for students. However, guidance is needed regarding the formation and meetings of such organizations.

C. PROCEDURES

1. Student organizations who desire to conduct activities in public school buildings or on public school grounds shall be permitted to conduct these activities only if authorized to do so and shall be subject to the supervision of the administration and faculty of the school. Student organizations meeting in schools must have a non-custodian staff member present in the school facility during their meetings.
2. Any group of students who desire to form an organization in the school shall submit a written list of objectives to the school principal or his/her designee for approval.
3. The principal may approve a student organization's use of a facility provided that:
 - a. The meeting is voluntary and student initiated. The principal must be assured that students are the ones promoting the activities and they are participating on their own volition.
 - b. Only students enrolled in the school may request the meetings. Principals assign personnel to the meetings in a supervisory non-influential capacity only. This action does not constitute sponsorship by the school system.
4. Any secret, exclusive, or self-perpetuating organization which seeks to organize and advance itself by taking in members from among the students enrolled in AACPS, upon the basis of decision of the membership of the organization, rather than from the free choice of any students in the school who are qualified to fill the special aims of the organization, are prohibited from conducting activities in AACPS buildings and on AACPS property.

5. Each school principal shall determine the allowable time that is available for approved student organizations to meet.
6. School or school system administration and staff may be present at religious meetings only in a supervisory capacity.
7. The presence of school or school systems authorities, employees or personnel at any student religious meeting shall be non-participatory in nature and does not constitute sponsorship. The presence of school authorities at such meetings shall be for the purpose of observation or supervision.
8. Meetings may not interfere with the conduct of regular instructional activities of the school. Since the education of the students is the prime responsibility of the school, any other activities are secondary. The school may deny facilities to students on the basis that the activities or meetings interfere with the instructional program.
9. Student meetings are not controlled, conducted, or directed by persons or groups not affiliated with the school. Visitors to the meeting must be approved by the principal or his/her designee. Approval for visitors' attendance must be obtained prior to the meeting. Visitors may not attend student meetings on a regular basis.
10. Meetings are open to all students without regard to actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, sexual orientation, genetic information, gender identity, or disability.
11. Students may form clubs for promoting the views of any partisan political organization which is authorized by Maryland Education Law to use public school facilities for political campaigns, during club meetings and in accord with Policy JCK – Student Political Activity.
