Benefits of Reading

- 1. Reading aloud is the single most important activity leading to literacy acquisition
- 2. Reading aloud builds language skills, motivation, curiosity, and memory
- 3. Reading aloud stimulates language development even before a child can speak
- 4. The more words parents use when speaking to an 8 month old infant, the greater the size of their child's vocabulary at age 3
- 5. One-to-one attention from parents during reading aloud encourage a positive association with books and reading later in life
- 6. Reading aloud helps children cope during times of stress and tragedy
- 7. Reading aloud exposes children rare words and ideas not found in daily conversations or screen time
- 8. Reading aloud provides an opportunity to practice listening, a crucial skill for kindergarten and beyond
- 9. Children's books contain 50% more rare words than prime time TV of even college students' conversations
- 10. Reading aloud is more likely to increase parent-child interaction than toy playing of other adult-child interactions
- 11. Reading aloud can play an important role in establishing regular wake and sleep patterns within children
- 12. Reading aloud improves peer relationships, coping strategies, and builds self-esteem
- 13. Reading for just 6 minutes can reduce stress up to 68%
- 14. Each time you read, you create synapses, which help increase memory
- 15. The more you read, the better you're able to spot patterns, a cornerstone of developing analytical skills
- 16. Reading is shown to improve writing skills
- 17. Reading increases your ability to empathize with others and connect with different cultures
- 18. Being read to helps kids learn how to express themselves clearly and confidently
- 19. Reading creates life-long lovers of learning and reading in children

- 20. Children whose parents read to them tend to become better readers and perform better in school
- 21. Reading to kids helps them with language and speech development
- 22, Reading expands children's vocabulary and teaches them how to pronounce new words
- 23. Reading to older kids helps them understand grammar and correct sentence structure
- 24. Being read to builds children's attention spans and helps them hone their listening skills
- 25. Being read to helps kids learn how to express themselves clearly and confidently
- 26. Curiosity, creativity and imagination are all developed while being read to
